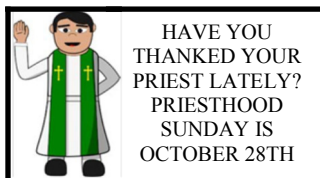
St. Romuald School is hosting a Fall Festival on October 26 & 27 at 408 Hwy 259, Hardinsburg, KY.
