White Mass for Healthcare Professionals



On Sunday, October 22, 2017, at 5:30 p.m. at the Cathedral of the Assumption (433 South Fifth Street, Louisville) Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz will preside at the White Mass, and **health care professionals of all faiths are invited to attend.** The White Mass gathers those who work in healthcare under the patronage of Saint Luke to ask God's blessing upon patients, doctors, nurses, and others who serve in this profession. All physicians are encouraged to wear their white coats for this special Mass.

Disaster Relief

Hurricane Maria caused terrible damage in places already affected by Hurricane Irma, including Puerto Rico, the Diocese of St. Thomas, and Cuba. Those in central Mexico were affected by a 7.1 magnitude earthquake not even three weeks after areas in southern Mexico experienced an 8.1 magnitude earthquake. Both earthquakes caused substantial damage in several dioceses, some of which are the poorest in the country. Rather than hold additional special collections for these disasters, here is the information of how you can help. Contributed funds will be used to support the reconstruction and pastoral needs of the Church as well as humanitarian and recovery assistance through Catholic Charities USA (Hurricane Maria) and Catholic Relief Services (Mexico earthquakes).
