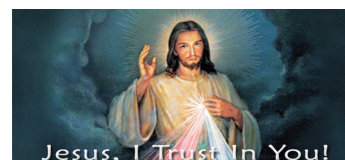

St. Mary & St. Theresa websites - Join us for Sunday Mass online with Father George Illikkal at 10 a.m. each Sunday until regular masses resume. To stream the Mass visit our websites: stmarypayneville.org or sttheresarhodelia.org Archbishop Kurtz has suspended the public celebration of Mass until further notice. Father George will offer the weekday and weekend Masses privately and will continue to offer Mass for our parishioners and the intentions listed in the bulletin. We are being discouraged from having any gatherings so we will only have the churches open on Sundays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. for private prayer, Adoration at St. Mary on Mondays and the Men's Prayer Group on Saturday mornings. We plan to continue to print the bulletin each week and will post it to the websites to keep everyone informed of parish news. We will put out a new minister's schedule and calendar when Masses and activities resume.

Mowing Season

Please note during mowing season at both St. Mary and St. Theresa Cemeteries, no benches, flower arrangements, statues, or any other objects are permitted on the ground that will interfere with mowing or weed-eating of the cemetery. Shepherds hooks are acceptable only if they are placed right next to the monument and the arrangements hanging from them don't interfere with mowing/weed-eating. Small statues or any other objects placed on the base of a monument must be glued to the base so they don't end up on the ground. Please note that when flower arrangements get blown off a grave due to winds, we have no way of knowing which grave they came from.

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

Say on each "Hail Mary" bead:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Conclusion

(Repeat 3 times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
